We are down to a few last assessments! Yeah! We are moving forward with some new activities in the classroom.

## Spirit Week

This week is Spirit Week. The students will be celebrating the Lake Shore Homecoming throughout the week. Attached to this newsletter is a second note outlining the dressing up activities planned for the week.

We will keep an eye on all of the students and may remove students to the classroom if it is too loud and/or overwhelming. I will be out of the classroom on Thursday October 12, 2017 in order to be at a school activity with my daughter. Mrs. Schwartenberg will be the guest teacher for the day.

Both ladies have been in for me before and love to work with the students. Please help me by reminding your student of expected behavior. Your student will have the opportunity to earn an award at the end of each day with the guest teacher by staying on a happy face.

## English Language Arts

We are starting ELA this year with letter of week. It is important skill for all of the students even those who may be working on more advanced skills such as reading sight words. It allows all of the students to review what they know and practice letter sound acquisition as well as improve their penmanship.

This week all students will be focusing on the letter A including the long sound (apron, ape, baby, cake) as well as the short A sound (animal, apple, alligator, acorn). We will also work on proper letter formation, identifying the letter in print and sorting it from other letters.

We will be making interactive letter notebooks. Much of the work we do as part of our lessons will be put into our notebooks. Those notebooks will come home at the end of school year.

We will also be using some of our ELA time to work on creating sentences whether a journal response or sequencing words to create a sentence. We will be focusing on starting our sentences with a capital, putting a finger space between each word, and ending the sentence with a period. We will discuss other punctuation marks in the future.

## Math

We will finally complete remaining math assessments this week. This is a very timeconsuming process, but does give me a great deal of information. I use the assessments to determine skills that students have and skills that need working on. The common theme coming through so far is that many students are demonstrating difficulty adding and subtracting numbers using touchpoints. Another common theme is that students are demonstrating difficulty telling time to the hour on analog clocks. We will be starting a unit on time in a couple of weeks.

This week we focus on learning the touchpoints on numbers $0-9$. Once the students can identify the numbers in print and learn to touch the points on the numbers and count them correctly then he/she can learn to use those touchpoints to add numbers. I will be sending home a sheet that shows all of the touchpoints for each number and how to count them.

Homework: Have your student practice sliding his/her finger over the number, naming it, and then count the touchpoints. Repeat this with each number 2-3 times per night. It will make a huge difference and help your student gain number recognition skills as well be able to learn to add and eventually subtract using touchpoints.

Sign and return the homework log on Friday indicating that your child practiced the numbers 2-3 times per night and he/she can earn extra pay for prize box shopping. I may even do a surprise raffle.

Each touchpoint on numbers 1-5 is counted by one. Touchpoints on numbers 6-9 have two circles at each point. Each circle is counted once and allow the students to add numbers once they are able to remember how to count the touch points. The larger inside circle is counted first and the smaller, thinner circle surrounding the larger circle is counted second.

For some students, this will be a review and for others this will be brand new material. We will use this week and next week to review how to count touchpoints as well as practice adding simple problems using Touchpoints. In a few weeks we will also review how to use manipulatives
to solve addition problems. Eventually we will be including adding numbers with a calculator to check our answers. This will allow students that opportunity to develop a variety of math skills. Memorizing math facts will be difficult for many students, but knowing how to perform a skill because he/she has been taught various strategies to perform said skill will increase success and retention.

Mrs. Glombowski, our social worker, and Mrs. Nichols, our speech and language teacher, began their social skills lesson last Monday. Last week started with an introduction to Social Skills including what they are, who they are used with and why they are important. Once this introduction was completed with the students then they had to color their names printed in bubble letters in order to glue them on the cover of their Skillstreaming Notebook. The notebooks will come home at the end of the school year. Attached to this newsletter is a copy of the introductory worksheet from last week.

Skillstreaming lessons will take place each Monday from 2:30-3:00 p.m. unless something comes up and Mrs. Glombowski and Mrs. Nichols are unable to make it to the lesson.
