Dear Parents,

I hope that everyone had a very relaxing Spring Break. We were able to get away for one night and just have some family fun. I hope that everyone had time to spend with each other and just be a family.

Today we are HAPPY to welcome Mrs. Jasinski back to school! Please remember that she will be taking it day by day to determine how she feels. We appreciate your kind thoughts and patience as she adjusts to coming back to work as well as undergoes chemotherapy throughout the remainder of the school year.

As April and May approaches please know that we are still very busy in the classroom. We will be giving the students the MI-Access State Test. The test is based on a combination of common core extended benchmarks as well as Michigan Extended Benchmarks. It is also divided into the three grade levels (6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>) as well as into the supported independence level and participation level tests. This test requires a primary and a shadow assessor to give the test in a one-on-one situation. We will slowly start testing students as Mrs. Stahl, our building Teacher Consultant, is available to come down and help shadow assess the test. We will be giving the test in small chunks so as not to overwhelm a student. Some of the questions are participation in an activity assessments and are not quickly administered, answered, or scored. We will do our best to make the testing situation and environment the most positive experience for your student as possible. Please understand that I must have this testing done by the middle to end of May and this will be the focus of our instructional time for the next six weeks.

In order to accommodate requests of admittance to our program it is necessary for me to be out of the classroom this Wednesday. There will be a guest teacher in the morning while I make a visit to another school to make an observation of a student. There is a possibility that I will be out of the classroom this Friday April 13, 2018 in order to make a second observation of a second student seeking admittance to our program. Again, there will be a guest teacher. This has yet to be confirmed.

# Wednesday April 11, 2017 is an early release date. Students will be dismissed at 1:55 p.m.

Thursday April 12, 2018 is our trip to the circus. We will be leaving KMS at 9:00 a.m. and return to KMS about 2:00 p.m. Please make sure that your student brings a sack lunch to school including a drink. We will be eating our lunches upon return to KMS. While at the circus we will be receiving a hot dog, water, and animal crackers. ## **English Language Arts**

**Letter of the Week**: Oo. All students will review writing capital and lower case Oo. All students will review the letter sound for Oo. Targeted instruction will be provided to specific students to help secure letter sound, writing, and identification.

**Pre-Primer Sight Word of the Week**: "is". Targeted instruction to specific groups of students will include writing "is" as well as identifying it in print and reading sentences.


First Grade Sight Word of the Week: Could. Targeted instruction to specific groups of students will include writing "fly" as well as identifying it in print and reading sentences.

**Personal Information**: Students have been working on memorizing and writing their personal information. Everyone is at a different level and pacing. Staff work with students individually to help improve their skill in this area.

All of the students will work on identifying the letters, sequencing the letters in their word, improving reading fluency by reading sentences or passages with their letter or word of the week in it, creating sentences including the word of the week, writing in sand and shaving cream, stamping their notebook, and rainbow writing in their notebooks. We keep copies of our fluency passages in our notebooks as well as send them home. I encourage you to read over the passages with your student.

## Math

*This week,* we will spend time reviewing a variety of skills including filling in a number line, perimeter, area, position words, and do a quick introduction/review of fractions. Students will complete a review worksheet as class and will complete a very similar worksheet as part of the homework. The work is similar to what students will experience on the state testing.
